Minister's Message

Dear Friends,

For some years I taught in a theological college in Cambridge and was out of pastoral ministry, and one thing I really missed during those years was going through the high and holy seasons, especially Christmas and Easter, with a congregation. I was of course still a member of a church, but because of certain commitments I had I did not get nearly so caught up in the celebration of Christmas and Easter as when I was actually pastoring a church. I sometimes used to get to the week before the big day and it would suddenly strike me that it would soon be past and over and that somehow it would have passed me by. Especially at Christmas time I would feel that I had been very caught up in all the trappings that go along with the season – shopping, writing Christmas cards, going to various parties and events – but that somehow the "heart of the matter" had escaped me.

That was one of the joys of returning to pastoral ministry and taking on two churches in Cambridge. Each year I became immersed once again in the stories, the narratives, the build-up, the extra services, such that by the time Christmas or Easter was over I felt that I had really done it justice — and that it had done its work on me. Each year I felt that in some deep way my life had been enriched and even transformed. And of course going through the high and holy seasons with a congregation is such a communal thing — it creates community. It is a shared experience and you come through such times feeling closer not only to God but to fellow believers.

We all know what a fraught and crazy season Christmas can be. But it can be a wonderful season too, one in which we approach the holy ground of profound mystery – the mystery of the Incarnation, of God becoming flesh, of power and majesty being laid aside and weakness and vulnerability being embraced. Such mysteries, however, require careful handling. They need to be approached carefully and with due preparation. We need to give time to them. That is why a special programme has been drawn up for Advent this year (see page 8). It includes activities for children and adults together each week and also a series of three bible studies on Wednesday evenings. Could I invite you to carefully consider attending these and making them part of your Christmas preparations?

I am so looking forward to Advent and Christmas this year. I am so looking forward once again to journeying through this wonderful festival, only this time with a new congregation, a new community. I pray that it will be an enriching experience for us all.

Consistory Meetings, October & November

Pastor Lance Stone chaired his first Consistory meeting in October, after his induction the previous weekend. Lots of issues needed to be addressed.

Membership matters:

- Otis William, son of Elise Bijkerk and Nick Sadler, would be baptized on 26 October.
- Janis, daughter of Susan Agbor and Elvis Ngah, would be baptized on 16 November.
- *Pastor Lance Stone* was admitted into membership of the English Reformed Church by transfer, through his induction.
- *Elisabeth van Oudgaarden* informed Consistory that she has accepted a position as OBGYN consultant in a hospital in Cumbria, England. She will move in the beginning of next year.

Consistory: Since there are no guidelines in the Church of Scotland, nor the *Protestantse Kerk Nederland*, supporting the present age limit for members of Consistory, we decided to abolish the aforementioned age limit. This means that from now on a member of Consistory may continue serving after reaching the age of 70.

The discussion about the procedure for choosing new Consistory members, started in June, continued. A proposal for a more transparent procedure was discussed at the November meeting. The discussion not only concerned the procedure for choosing new members but also the distinction we make between elders and deacons (not now common in the Church of Scotland), the number of Consistory members and the period of serving on the Consistory. The tasks of elders towards pastoral care of the congregation was also discussed. We will be continuing the discussion at our next meeting. The aim is to have the changes in effect at the beginning of the new year.

We need at least two new members on a shorter notice and would therefore follow the present procedure for those.

Stichting Het Begijnhof: In October the court had ruled in favour of the *Stichting Begijnhof* (Begijnhof Foundation). The dispute between the ERC and the Stichting centered around times, access and control. Due to a number of circumstances the ERC had not been able to present the court with a defense. The ERC has now changed legal representation and our new lawyer drafted a complaint immediately after the ruling. A committee of members of the congregation and others with legal and historical knowledge will be assisting Consistory and the lawyer in this case. The ruling of the court had no immediate consequences. In the coming period we will continue to seek contact with the board of the Stichting Het Begijnhof and our neighbours.

Finances: The income and expenditure sheets of August and September 2014 were discussed. The prognosis is satisfactory: income and expenses are in line. This is the result of lower costs on wages during the vacancy period. However, the declining income is a matter of concern, in light of the budget for 2015. The budget, based on the same level of income as 2014, shows a deficit of €25,000, to be taken from our reserves. We have to work towards bringing back our income (mainly collections and donations) to a higher level. Fundraising will be needed.

The budget proposal for 2015 was approved by Consistory.

Mulanje Mission: Ruth Shakespeare, administrator of Mulanje Mission Hospital in Malawi, had been in Amsterdam the previous weekend. She had a meeting with some members of the Mulanje committee, Pastor Lance and a representative of the Rotary Club.

Other matters: Pastor Lance Stone and Presbytery Elder Baafi Sekyere had represented the ERC at the Presbytery of Europe meeting in Budapest in October. Given the fact that congregations outside of Europe are now part of the Presbytery, it was decided to rename the Presbytery. From now on it is to be called the International Presbytery of the Church of Scotland.

The next Consistory meeting will be held on 1 December.

When you read this *Record*, I will have finished the preparation of the 2015 budget for our congregation. Our income is still significantly lower when compared to 2013, and I have no indication that this will change. Therefore our budget for 2015 currently has a financial gap of about €25,000, which we can only compensate by using our savings reserves.

Unfortunately, with the current financial situation we are in the uncomfortable situation of having to use our reserves just to be able to satisfy our immediate obligations. For years we employed a student assistant minister and later a youth worker, who did great work among our young people and the 20s/30s group. Because of the difficult financial situation I was not in a position to include the position of a youth worker/youth minister in our budget for 2015. Therefore I urge each and every one of you to think and pray about your financial priorities and how you are able to support God's ministry in our congregation. It would be great if we could not only close 2015 without a deficit, but have even more to employ a Youth Worker or a Youth Minister!

The Clock is Back and Ticking!



After almost a year, the clock has been repaired and is back in the sanctuary of the church. The clock maker, by the name of Menno Hoenkamp, has reported as follows:

*the clock work is of solid construction and was made around 1800, and is, after the repairs, in good condition

*as a result of the repair work, the clock has become almost silent and there will be no more need for it to be stopped for concerts, as has been confirmed by our concert manager Kenneth Ewen

*the front has been dusted and cleaned and looks refreshed

*the clock maker has re-installed it in the frame more solidly and has assured us that it cannot be pushed back, an accident that happened previously

*on the front of the clock there are three holes:

the top hole is for regulating the clock when it is running slow or fast, by very marginal and careful adjustments of not more than 5 degrees of the clock work with a special key

the middle hole is for weekly winding of the clock, by 16 turns, for which the clock maker has provided a new key

the lower hole is for stopping the clock, by using a special instrument

The clock maker has warned us that if the clock, especially the regulation of it, is not handled with the utmost care, the clock work could be severely damaged again.

In the meantime, enjoy the almost silent ticking!
