Minister's Letter

Dear Friends,

The past couple of weeks our church has been touched by sadness as we have gathered for the funerals of two long-standing and much-loved members; Jose Monkau and Lotty Veelbehr. I am grateful that I have to conduct very few funerals in this church and having two so close together was a first for me here. Because Lotty and Jose had been around for so long and had served the church in different ways they were repositories of memories and their passing feels like the severing of links with the past, a cutting of ties to former days.

As I write this, however, I am very aware that we are soon to be losing others from our congregation, not through death but through moving away. So in the next few weeks we will be saying goodbye to two of our elders: Nick Thomas, as he moves back to the UK with Cara, Zahra and Will, and Sarah Wang as she is relocated by her work to Singapore. Nick, Cara, Zahra, Will, Sarah have all made a huge contribution to the life of our church and it's hard to imagine the church without them. And they are not all: I know of several others who will be moving on in the coming months. And thus it always has been, especially in an English-speaking congregation in a city like Amsterdam, but it does seem to be increasingly a feature of modern life. People move around the globe more than they once did, often staying in places for relatively short periods, working on short-term contracts, and it leaves organisations like churches more fluid and less fixed and stable than they once were.

That, of course - thankfully - is only one side of the story. The good news is that there are always new people coming in too. Not a week goes by when I do not greet new people who are 'trying us out', maybe for the first time - and that is quite apart from the many visitors from all over the world who come our way as they visit Amsterdam for a few days. Not all of these people of course 'stick' but several do.

Can I therefore request that more regular attenders of our church make every effort to be on the look-out for new people and to make sure that these new people are welcomed? Every Sunday our liturgy sheet proclaims, 'within these walls let no-one be a stranger', but that does not happen automatically - it needs to be worked at. I am delighted that we have a 'Welcome Desk' and we need more people to staff that. Maybe you could take a turn? But aside from that we must all be sure to greet people we sit beside who we don't know, and to look out for people who are standing on their own over coffee after the service. At our recent Annual General Meeting we devoted some time to discussing this and how we make sure that, indeed, no-one leaves the church 'a stranger'. That way we can be sure that in the midst of much change our church continues to grow and to be enriched.

Consistory Report

In this report I give you a summary of the meetings of Consistory in March, April and May 2019.

Membership matters

We received notice of the passing of Mrs José Monkau. José passed away on April 25th. José was a long-time member of the church, very active in Coffee mornings and for years she sold cards, bibles and other books after the service. José moved to a home in Volendam a couple of years ago.

After the May Consistory meeting another member of the ERC passed away: Ms Lotty Veelbehr died on May 7th. Lotty was part of our church for more than 60 years. Although her mobility was compromised in the last years, she still enjoyed coming to church especially when the choir was singing, the choir she had been a part of for decades. The Easter service was the last she attended.

Consistory was happy to approve Ivan Digber as Sunday School teacher.

The Voorhoeve-Fleury family transferred their membership to the Doopsgezinde Gemeente.

During the year Consistory will be facing some changes: by the end of June Sarah Ying Wang will relocate to Singapore due to her work. Nick Thomas, his wife Cara and their two children Zahra and William decided to return to England. They will leave in August.

Mulanje Mission

An extra appeal for Mulanje after the floods in March raised more than €4.000,00.

A Mulanje Mission Charity evening will be held later this year. More details will follow in the next issue of the Record.

Outreach

The Angels Yarn Bombing initiative is progressing. More and more knitted angels are brought to church, knit-ins are being organised (see elsewhere in this issue) so that people can support and inspire each other. We are working towards Christmas, when the angels will convey our Christmas message to the city.

The Internationale Diaconie Vergadering was attended. The goal of the meeting was to exchange best practices on how refugees could be helped. A follow up with the meeting organizers will take place to discuss how the ERC could best support the causes discussed in the meeting.

A ERCAdam team will participate yet again in the Night of the Refugee (Nacht van de Vluchteling), a sponsored walk (20 km) to raise awareness and funds for emergency aid to refugees.

Theme focused meeting

At the last Away Day (a retreat day for Consistory) in February we expressed the need to make space in the Consistory meetings for more in-depth discussions around a theme. We decided that we would have three of these meetings a year, starting with the April one. We continued the discussion we started in February around the topic of why God has put and kept our church here. Consistory talked about the importance of prayer life, both as an individual and as a church, the importance of prayers of intercession and what we could do to enhance prayer life within our congregation.

We also discussed a topic brought forward by the International Presbytery: how can we celebrate the multicultural make-up of congregations within the Presbytery? How do we relate diversity to the fact that we have a traditional liturgy, with mainly classical music and a traditional CH4 Hymnary? Diversity should also be reflected in age, nationalities, gender, other denominations and religions. We have a community with the churches around the Spui, etc. But how about building bridges towards other belief systems?

We will continue this discussion in the next theme focused meeting.

Property

We are looking for good options for digital means for collection and for the donation box, accommodating people from all over the world. This would go along with a display of the church's activities to be on show during the week and aimed at tourists and visitors. Unfortunately, neither our own bank nor a Dutch company who presented their app for charities and churches could cater for our specific needs. We are now looking into options from the UK. We hope to make progress with this topic during the summer.

Other competent business

Pastor Lance is looking into the possibility of holding a short service during lunchtime on e.g. Thursdays to pray for the city.

Pastor Lance will be away for four Sundays at the end of July and the first half of August. Rev John Bell will be with us on three Sundays.

Consistory meetings are held each first Sunday of the month (except in August, dates are subject to change in the case of a national holiday). If you have a topic you would like to discuss with Consistory, please contact the minister or the scriba.

Annual General Meeting

On April 7, around 40 people stayed behind after the service to participate in the Annual General Meeting of the ERC. Here are some of the highlights.

Pastor Lance felt heartened by various groups just seem to happen. Apart from the Bible Study, several discussion groups started, live as well as in Whatsapp group. Mission and outreach are topics that were and will be discussed in Consistory and with the congregation: why are we put in this place and are we still here? What is our mission? A short brainstorm led to a number of thoughts e.g. a spiritual home in a diverse city, be an example of God's work. Important is that we live up to the sentence "Within these walls, let no one be a stranger". Not everyone feels as welcome as we would wish. Pastor Lance will ask people to introduce themselves to their neighbours in the pews. We are also looking into forming a welcome group, as an extension of the welcome desk.

Pastor Lance also talked about a plan that will be discussed in the General Assembly regarding the future of the church. The number of ministers is declining, which will have consequences for the congregations in the International Presbytery as well.

During the meeting we thanked our staff and all volunteers who provide stability in the long running initiatives as well as the new ones. We thanked Tom Flanagan, who after having co-ordinated our work in the Kloof every month, felt it was time to hand over. Also, a special thank you to Jens Sørensen who amongst other things does a tremendous job in keeping our website up to date.

Thorsten König, treasurer, led us through the finances. In short: we do have a surplus of around €10.000 (including the financial support of the Friends for the maintenance of the church), but our reserves need to be increased. The contribution we pay towards the Church of Scotland is, after a long discussion, settled to a €9.000 per annum, which is very reasonable. The accounts were audited by Sies Plokker and Eduard Starrenburg.

There is a wonderful tribute in the latest MMH Newsletter, which you can read on their website, to her dedication to helping the people of Malawi and previously, South Africa, Zimbabwe and England.



Dr Ruth, as she was known, has led some major improvement projects at MMH, including the solar power installation, diagnostics laboratory, X-Ray machine and operating theatre. With plenty of energy she inspired many colleagues over the years and is known to be a good listener making time for visitors, patients, student nurses as well as making time for her hobbies which

include birdwatching and cheese-making.

Her experience in public health has helped the hospital to focus on preventative medicine and community work - malaria control, safe water and sanitation. The staff at MMH saw many improvements including in their own housing and Thandizani resource centre.

Together with her husband, Ken, she is taking a well-deserved rest and is cycling 1200km across France. We hope to see her when she is in Amsterdam on holiday and we especially look forward to building a relationship with Dr Arie Glas and his family.
